Fisher most recently served as CEO and President of the South County Outreach – Hunger and Homeless Services Agency in Irvine, California, earning the distinction of 2019 California Nonprofit of the Year and chairing a county-wide, 18-agency member Family Solutions Collaborative.

Her prior position with Boy Scouts of America solidified her exceptional fundraising and donor relations skills on a national level, as featured on the Today Show, Good Morning America, Oprah, among others, as well as national and local print media.



Her career began at Loras College in marketing and media relations roles of increasing responsibility. Fisher holds a Master of Arts degree in Public Relations from the University of Northern Iowa and a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and Journalism from Iowa State University.
